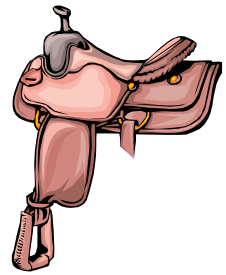

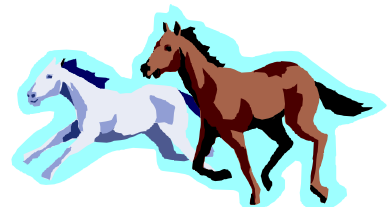

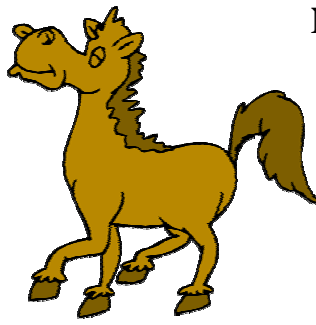

Winterize Your Horse:

Horses, unlike ATVs can't be put up on blocks for winter just because they're not being used. As the cold months of winter close around us concern for our horse's health and condition becomes more important. Horses can tolerate considerable cold if they can move around and dry. If your horse is both an indoor and outdoor kind be sure to watch your barn temperature and your animal's hair growth. During the mild early months of winter allow your horse to develop his thick coat. Avoid blanketing during this time. If your horse has been properly acclimated, the horse should stay comfortable as the temperature falls provided he has an area to escape the wind and wet. The danger with blanketing outdoor-bound horses they tend to slip causing rubbing and sores, and may become damp themselves, serving to chill the horse, not warm him/her. When working horses in cold weather, warm horses up slowly and thoroughly before asking for serious work. In cold weather horses are more "cinchy" when being saddled, so be sure to move them before mounting. Hot horses need to be cooled out thoroughly then brushed to stand the hair up again before turning them back out. Fluffy keeps the horse warm; hair plastered down flat or wet lets body heat escape. Hoof care is also important during the winter. Many owners forget the farrier until spring arrives. The hoof will probably grow at least a small amount and need balancing to keep its proper shape and avoid any unnatural wear. Bruising may occur on the sole from hard ground and ice. If your horse is shod or not, clean his feet daily. Winter does not have to be a time of little riding and much work. Allow nature to progress and continue a top management program. Saddle up and have a good ride.
